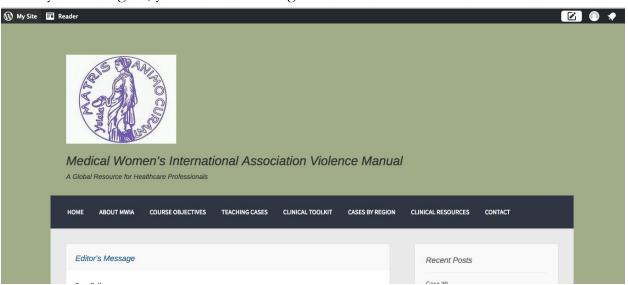


# 1) How to Log On:

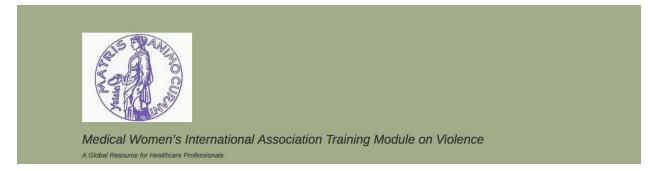

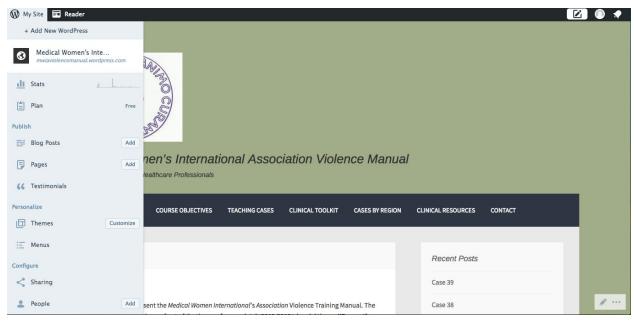
## 2) How to start editing

When you first log on, you see the following screen:

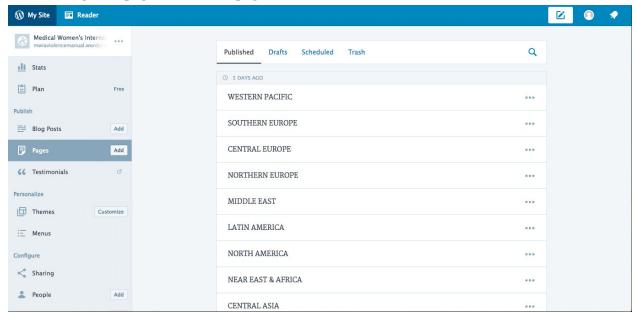


Click on the top left, "My Site" To Open Editing Options such as "blog posts" and "pages"





Add or Edit Existing Pages or Blog Posts by Navigating tabs on the left. This shows what screen appears if "pages" is selected. This allows one to edit all the information on all pages, from the regional pages to contact page.

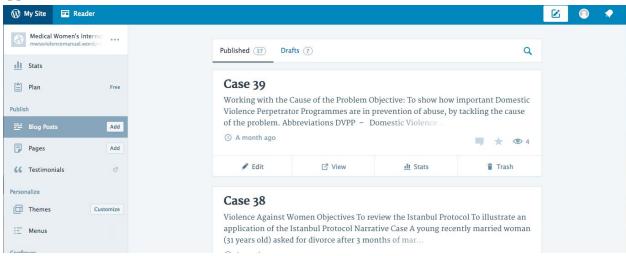




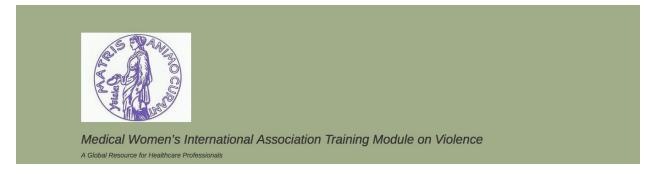
## 3) How to Add Tags

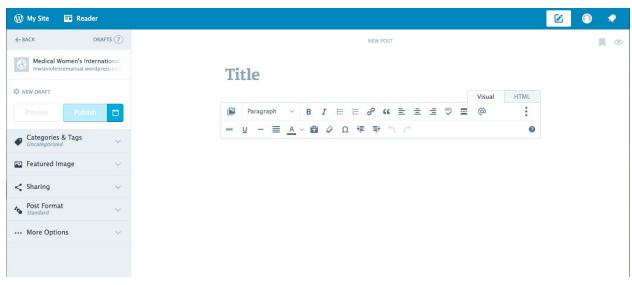
Note that we have tagged cases by regions, as listed below, and by content. The tags appear at the bottom of the post.

After logging on, choose "Blog Posts" on the left hand pane. The following screen should appear.

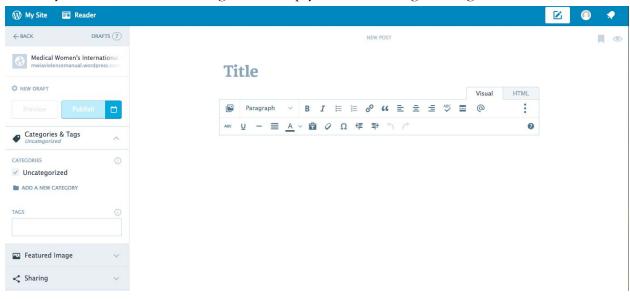


Click "Add", or choose an existing case. The same editing screen appears:





Choose "Categories and Tags". Deselect "No Category", and add Tags by typing them in manually. Refer to our MWIA regions to help you choose a regional tag.

## 4) Limitations of the Webpage Template

Dear incoming editor,

While we thank you for continuing to update and enhance the webpage, we began this project with the understanding this would occur within the existing template for the webpage. While we invite you to add many more blog posts, cases, and regionally-specific resources via the "Pages" and "Blog" section, we highly advise against changes to the "Themes" and "Menu" sections. This is because there is a high likelihood of rearranging, deleting or drastically changing formatting of the webpage, with the risk of losing critical information. This infact, occured over the course of developing the page, and the initial editing team had the chance to learn firsthand from these mistakes. We hope that with this guide, you do not fall into the same situation, as it takes hours to repair the damage.
